WHY?

Offering new possibilities for area studies, particularly in the "South"

Reducing academic asymmetry between the Harvards and the Have-Nots

Researching *with* rather than *about* regions; participation, interaction and discussion made possible for everyone

Modernising area studies in keeping with an increasingly Internet-based research culture

Internationalising academic research through multilingual publications and Internet accessibility

WHAT?

Leibniz Association is a signatory of the Berlin Declaration supporting the active promotion of OA

Transformation of four internationally renowned and peer-reviewed journals, which also continue to be published in print form, into OA publications

Joint publication structure and consistent appearance of all GIGA journals

Ongoing quality control through indexing and abstract services such as ISI-SSCI

Use of the web-based Open Journal Systems (OJS) for workflow management
